

Sociology Concentration - Requirements Timing Chart

This chart is a guide for Sociology concentrators. These timings are the recommended course sequence, but each concentrator should evaluate their individual situation when choosing courses. [Meet with an adviser](#) if you have any questions or concerns about course timing or concentration requirements.

Introduction: SOCIOL 1000 (or SOCIOL 1001-1089 by petition)	First or Sophomore
Social Theory Tutorial: SOCIOL 97	First or Sophomore
Models of Social Research: SOCIOL 1128	Sophomore Spring
Statistics for Social Sciences: SOCIOL 1156 (or STAT 100, 102, 104, 139 by petition)	Sophomore or Junior
Junior Tutorial: SOCIOL 98	Junior
5 additional courses with a SOCIOL prefix	As able
2 courses in Related Fields: AAAS; ANTH; EASTD; EC; EMR; GHHP; GOV; HIST; HISSCI; PSYCH; SOCSTUD; WGS, or SOCIOL prefix.	As able
Senior Thesis Tutorials (Honors Only): SOCIOL 99A and 99B	Senior Fall (99A) and Senior Spring (99B)

Pass/Fail or Sat/Unsat - Students may take up to 2 elective courses or related field courses that are graded Pass/Fail or Sat/Unsat. This includes concentration credit issued for study abroad. Joint concentrators must take all courses for a letter grade.

92R Faculty Research Assistantship Program - Counts toward one of the 2 elective courses that concentrators may take as Sat/Unsat. Joint concentrators may participate in 92R, but they may not count it for concentration credit.

Double-counting courses:

- **Secondary Field** – Students may double-count one course for both their concentration and secondary field.
- **Double-concentration** – A limit of 8 credits (generally 2 courses) may be double counted between the two concentrations.
- **Joint concentration** – No courses may be double counted between the primary and allied concentration.
